CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

Established in 2000, the Manitoba Federation of Labour's Judy Cook Award for Woman of Achievement recognizes women trade unionists who have made significant contributions to our labour movement.

The Judy Cook Award is awarded by the MFL Women's Committee, and was created to honour Sister Judy Cook for her work as a feminist trade unionist, which has benefited our movement and the wider social justice community.

The MFL Women's Committee invites all MFL affiliates to consider nominating union sisters for this award. The award will be presented next at the 2022 MFL Convention in Brandon.

JUDY COOK – A FEMINIST CHAMPION

The Judy Cook Women of Achievement Award honours sisters who are (or have been) a member of a union affiliated with the MFL/CLC and have contributed significantly to advancing women's and labour rights.

The award honours and celebrates the late Judy Cook. Sister Cook was the Executive Director of the MFL Occupational Health Centre from 1985 until her passing in 1998. Judy's life was marked by an extraordinary commitment to social justice and improving the quality of life of working people.

A major focus of her commitment was her work in preventing occupational injuries and disease, and highlighting how they are embedded in social and political factors.

Born in St. Louis, Missouri, Sister Cook was active in the American Civil rights movement in the 1960's. She then brought her passion and experience to Canada in the 1970's, focusing her attention on community health and the labour movement.

Prior to her tenure with the MFL Occupation Health Centre, Judy was director of volunteer services with Klinik Community Health Centre (Winnipeg). In her role there, she helped organize Klinik workers into a Canadian Union of Public Employees local. Sister Cook was also active on the boards of Legal Aid Manitoba and the Community Unemployed Help Centre.

"I remember marching with her, singing with her and generally having a most excellent time. Judy Cook was a real Sister in the struggle, a genuine "bread and roses" woman. If to live in the hearts we leave behind is not to die, then Judy is living today, here with us. And, we could do nothing better than to remember Sister Judy Cook and follow her example."
